NY Great Lakes Information Clearinghouse Now Online

New York's Great Lakes region supports local and regional economies; provides diverse recreational, maritime education, and tourism opportunities; and holds high ecological importance among the state's natural resources. Audiences looking for New York Great Lakes information on a wide range of issue areas now have a clearinghouse resource as a starting point for learning more about this vital region.

In 2016, New York Sea Grant (NYSG), in partnership with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), developed and launched a web-based clearinghouse of information about the Great Lakes region of New York State.

The site at www.nyseagrant.org/nygreatlakes acts as a portal through which users can access resources related to research projects, grants, New York's Great Lakes Action Agenda priorities, and information on coastal processes, ecosystems and habitats, fisheries, energy, education, Great Lakes communities, coastal recreation and tourism, and water quality.

This website was designed to provide audiences of all backgrounds, from environmental researchers and agency personnel to teachers and students, with an abundance of New York Great Lakes' information.

Examples of resources on the site are:

- Great Lakes Coastal Resilience Planning Guide published by the NOAA Digital Coast Partnership
- National Weather Service Marine Forecasts
- NYS Department of State Office of Planning & Development Geographic Information Gateway
- a hotlink to the New York Invasive Species Information website.

Personnel with environmental agencies and organizations statewide tested the website for user-friendliness and provided resources. Users can submit comments and questions via the *Contact Us* feature and subscribe to the NY Great Lakes Basin listserv for news, funding opportunities and event notices.
